In 2021, we celebrated the 75th Anniversary of the global Fulbright Program. Since the program's inception in 1946, over 400,000 people from 160 countries have participated in the Fulbright Program, enriching their education, advancing their careers, and making meaningful contributions abroad and at home. Throughout 2021, the dedicated anniversary website (https://fulbright75.org) featured stories, news, and events, recognizing the program's history of positive impact on the lives of individuals as well as on global and local communities.

The Fulbright Program is the U.S. government's flagship international educational and cultural exchange program, creating connections in a complex and changing world. Led by the U.S. government in partnership with 160 countries worldwide, Fulbright offers programs for passionate and accomplished students, scholars, teachers, artists, and professionals of all backgrounds to study, teach, and conduct research, helping to build mutual understanding and find solutions to critical international concerns.

One connection at a time, Fulbright brings people together and moves nations towards a more peaceful world.

In Romania, the Fulbright Program has been present since 1960, bringing durable changes on Romania's path to progress and democratization, and profoundly influencing lives and professional careers, communities at large.

Since 1960, over 3400 Romanians and Americans participated in these exchanges, benefitting from funding for graduate studies, research, teaching, professional development, and cultural exchanges in general.

The Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission was inaugurated in May 1993 with the support of the American and Romanian Governments, following the bilateral agreement between the U.S. Department of State and the Romanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission offers exchange opportunities to Romanian citizens – scholars, students and professionals - for study, research and teaching in the United States, in any subject and at any accredited U.S. higher education institution. Grants are awarded through open merit-based competitions supervised by bi-national panels.

Candidates may apply in any field except clinical disciplines, allowing for the specific timeline of each competition for Romanian citizens. Grant duration varies from a couple of weeks to one academic year, depending on the category of grant the applicant wants to apply for.

The Fulbright Grants

- The Fulbright Student Program awards for Romanian graduate students for master's study or research at accredited U.S. universities;
- The Fulbright Visiting Scholar Program awards for Romanian professors, researchers and professionals who have a doctoral degree or equivalent (certified) to conduct research and/or lecture at accredited U.S. universities.
- The Fulbright-RAF Visiting Scholar Award dedicated to Romanian academics from technical universities/faculties who wish to carry out a semester-long fellowship in residence at the University of Rochester – AIN Center for Entrepreneurship.
- The Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program for mid-career professionals with demonstrated leadership potential, public service commitment and the capacity to take full advantage of a self-defined program of independent study at a leading U.S. university.
- Fulbright Teaching Excellence and Achievement
 Program Media Literacy Cohort: a six-week
 professional development program for secondary-level school teachers;
- Study of the U.S. Institutes for European Student
 Leaders a five-week academic program for undergraduate students;
- The Fulbright Scholar-in-Residence Program offers opportunities to non-U.S. visiting scholars from different countries, including Romania, to teach at U.S. colleges and universities for one or both semesters of one academic year.
- The Fulbright Schuman Program offers scholarships to European citizens for research or lecture in the United States on a topic that is relevant to US-EU relations, EU affairs/policy, or EU institutions and shows relevancy to at least two EU member states.

Fulbright offers programs for passionate and accomplished U.S. students, scholars, teachers, artists, and professionals of all backgrounds to study, teach, and conduct research in Romania, helping to build mutual understanding between our two countries and to find solutions to critical international concerns.

Applications in any field are welcome. According to the policies established by the Romanian Fulbright Board, the program tries to reach as many local universities and students as possible. The Commission strongly encourages grantees to travel to other university centers to give public talks and lectures, attend conferences and participate in American Corners events and other similar activities.

The Fulbright Grants

Grants For American Citizens

- The U.S. Scholar Program is designed for American academics, professionals, and artists with a Ph.D. (or other terminal degree) interested to teach, conduct research and/or undertake professional or artistic projects in Romania in a wide variety of academic and professional fields. The U.S. Scholar Program also includes "Hyphenated" grants, which are partly sponsored by Romanian universities and mirror both the interest in the Fulbright program of higher education institutions and the intention of the Fulbright Commission to increase the number of grants it offers.
- The U.S. Student Program offers recent graduates, post-graduate candidates, professionals and artists an opportunity to teach or conduct research in Romania, through English Teaching Assistant (ETA) Awards or Research Awards. Candidates at all degree levels will be considered, but preference is given to advanced graduate students who are interested in international education and teaching. The Commission accepts proposals in all disciplines.
- The Fulbright Specialist Program (FSP) promotes linkages between U.S. academics and professionals and their counterparts at host institutions in Romania. The program is designed to award grants to qualified U.S. faculty and professionals, in select disciplines, to engage in short-term collaborative projects at host institutions which initiate these projects. To participate in the program, host institutions must develop and submit project proposals, and U.S. experts must apply to join the Fulbright Specialist Roster.

Fulbright at 75:

A Global Response to Global Opportunities and Challenges



On May 18, 2021 the Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission honored 75 years since the global Fulbright Program was initiated and 60+ years of its presence in Romania through a virtual event titled "Fulbright at 75: A Global Response to Global Opportunities and Challenges."

The celebration, moderated by Executive Director Mircea Dumitru, brought together distinguished U.S. and Romanian high officials, Fulbright alumni, partners, and friends who joined us online to mark this significant milestone. We were honored to be joined by Acting Assistant Secretary Matthew Lussenhop, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Minister of Foreign Affairs Bogdan Aurescu, Scott A Reese, Public Affairs Counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Romania, and Nicolae-Victor Zamfir, President of the Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission's Board of Directors, for the welcome and opening remarks.

Romanian & U.S. alumni E. Patrick McDermott, Vlad Mixich, Amy Liu, Kathleen Laraia McLaughlin, Ioana Mischie, and Augustin Ioan shared their thoughts on the impact and significance of the worldwide Fulbright Program and its role in the development of academic and cultural relations between Romania and the U.S., as exemplified through their professional and personal Fulbright stories. The event was part of the Fulbright Country Day initiative launched by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs to celebrate the 75th Anniversary.

Internationalization of Romanian Higher Education – The Role of the Fulbright Program

On April 12, 2021, the Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission, in partnership with the Faculty of Political, A d m in istrative and Communication Sciences (FSPAC), Babeş-Bolyai University, organized a livestreamed workshop on the role played by the Fulbright Program towards the internationalization of higher education in Romania.

The event brought together Romanian and U.S. Fulbright alumni, distinguished guest speakers from four major U.S. universities, representatives of the Fulbright Commission and of Babeş-Bolyai University.



The invited guests discussed about the significant contribution the Fulbright Program has had on the academic and cultural relations between Romania and the U.S., emphasizing its role in the institutional development of Romanian universities, not only in terms of research and teaching, but foremost in terms of advancing internationalization.

Cybersecurity in Universities - Study Visits to the U.S.

The Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission together with Fulbright Commissions based in Poland, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Hungary, and Slovak Republic co-organized the competition for a new program addressed to academics in the field of cybersecurity.

Originally planned as an inperson study visit in the U.S., the program was redesigned to a hybrid format due to the restrictions imposed by Covid-19 and the competition deadline was extended until December 20, 2020. Out of 30 selected participants from 9 eligible countries, 6 are Romanian academics from universities that have cybersecurity programs (or with a program near to open) in lasi, Brasov, Sibiu, Constanta, Cluj, and Bucharest.

The program started with a virtual component, including 16 online meetings extended over a 4-month period (March-June



2021), and will continue with an in-person visit to the U.S. in Spring 2022.

The program is founded by ECA through Fulbright Poland and it is carried out in partnership with World Learning and Marymount University.

COMMISSION UPDATES

Media Literacy & Critical Thinking Workshop for EFL Teachers



On September 2 & 3, 2021, the Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission organized a twoday training workshop aiming to provide current secondarylevel English teachers with know-how and tools to integrate media literacy and critical thinking in their classrooms. The event took place at the National Library of Romania and brought together 43 middle and high school teachers from around the country.

The workshop, titled "Teaching Excellence: Promoting Media Literacy and Critical Thinking in the English Class," opened with welcome addresses by Mr. Sandeep Paul, Information Officer at the U.S. Embassy in Romania, Dr. Rodica Cherciu, Inspector General with the Ministry of Education, and Prof. Mircea Dumitru, Executive Director of the Fulbright Commission, who underlined the timeliness and relevance of the workshop in an age when facts are easily being turned into fiction, as well as the need to focus on early education to increase a longterm societal resilience to disinformation.

The presentations, lectures, and interactive workshops that followed were coordinated by our Fulbright Teaching Excellence and Achievement (Fulbright TEA) Program alumnae Iuliana Dode, Elvira Kiss, Corina Mitrulescu, Corina Moise-Poenaru, and Nadina Nicolici. They shared, in turn, their own take on best practices and creative teaching methodologies for integrating media literacy and

critical thinking in the EFL classroom, showcasing various tools for nurturing critical reflection skills among middle and high school students. By tackling themes like fake news, propaganda, misinformation, and disinformation and focusing on a variety of innovative teaching methods and strategies to help students separate fact from fiction, build critical thinking skills, and overcome information overload, the sessions coordinated by the Fulbright TEA alumnae provided the most fruitful ground for discussion.

The event was made possible through funding received from the State Department's Teacher Exchange Branch.

The Annual American Studies Student Conference – Virtual Edition

On May 21, 2021 the Fulbright Commission had the pleasure of acting as virtual host of the annual American Studies Student Conference, organized by the English Department of the University of Bucharest. The theme of this year's edition was a topical one: "The Concept of Crisis in American Culture".

This year's edition brought together participants from around the country, as well as international participants. Following an engaging presentation by the guest of honor, William O'Connor, Cultural Affairs Officer at the U.S. Embassy in Bucharest, the participants delivered thoughtprovoking presentations on topics ranging from hyphenated identities and residential segregation to hyperreality. The quality of the papers and the dynamic presentation style were highly appreciated by the audience. The conference jury had the difficult task of nominating only one paper as the winner of the "Dan Grigorescu" Award for the best American Studies conference paper and, after careful deliberation, the award went to MA student Sânziana-Miruna Popa, for her paper titled "Portrayals of the African American Community in The Birth of a Nation (2016)".



Virtual Pre-Departure Orientation for 2021-2022 Romanian Fulbright Students

On July 7, 2021, the Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission hosted a Virtual Pre-departure Orientation Seminar devoted to the Romanian Fulbright Student grantees leaving for the U.S. to study or conduct research in the next academic year (2021-2022).

The participants had the opportunity to interact with Fulbright alumni, but also with current Romanian grantees in the U.S. who were able to join us via Zoom. The session included lively discussions on various topics about living in the United States and about the U.S. academic environment, from practical issues (housing;



financial matters; staying safe c o m m u n i t y w o r k ; communication with home; travel in the US; special procedures and experiences during the pandemic) to ways of dealing with culture shock and adapting in a different academic environment (crosscultural matters; academic integrity; research opportunities; extracurricular activities; campus facilities; social life; campus jobs; internships).

COMMISSION UPDATES

Program Presentations and Seminars



As the Covid-19 pandemic continued to pose significant challenges during FY2021, most program presentations and seminars for promoting Fulbright competitions and offering guidance to potential applicants pivoted to an online format.

We're including below a selection, with the mention that the Fulbright alumni and grantees who accepted to share their experience and knowledge had an essential contribution to the success of these events. - On March 11, 2021, Dr. Daniela Staicu, 2018-2019 Fulbright Student Researcher at Penn State University, Humanitarian Engineering and Social Entrepreneurship Program, was the guest speaker during an online seminar titled "Fulbright Student Application Walkthrough."

Daniela addressed several topics of interest to applicants planning to conduct research or enroll in a master's program in the U.S. through the Fulbright Student Program.

She touched upon topics such as writing the Fulbright application, identifying a graduate school program, asking for recommendations, and writing a solid CV. - On March 23, 2021, the Romanian-U.S. Fulbright Commission organized an online workshop on essay writing, coordinated by Boston Kistka, Graduate Assistant at SUNY-University at Buffalo and EducationUSA Romania virtual intern.

During the workshop, Boston discussed with the participants – mainly prospective Fulbright applicants – about the components of strong essays by analyzing excerpts from successful Fulbright applications, and offered recommendations on the skills or qualifications to be highlighted in the texts. The workshop also covered topics like language and style for effective essay writing.

& GRANT-SUPPORTING ACTIVITIES

• On April 13, 2021, the Commission organized another online seminar titled "Engage in the Fulbright Adventure: From applying to experiencing the U.S. academic life."

The webinar was conducted by Andreea Cristina Sfia, 2019-2020 Fulbright grantee, Master's in Aerospace Engineering, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, and Ionuț Daniel Șerban, 2019-2020 Fulbright Student Researcher in the field of Environmental Studies, University of Massachusetts Boston.

Andreea and Ionuț offered insider's tips on the application process, together with their suggestions and best practices to help applicants structure the most important components of their application, such as essays, CVs, recommendations, and select their U.S. school/program options. The alumni also talked a b o ut their Fulbright experiences at ERAU and UMass Boston, their life and achievements as international graduate students before and during the pandemic.

• On July 6, 2021, the Fulbright Commission hosted a webinar dedicated to Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program applicants. Our special guest was Amedeea Enache, 2020-2021 Humphrey Fellow at University of Minnesota, in the field of Economic/Sustainable Development. Amedeea shared her perspective on the application process, along with practical suggestions from her own experience as a Humphrey fellow.

• On September 30, 2021, the Commission hosted the webinar "Preparing a Strong Application for the Fulbright Visiting Scholar Program." Fulbright Alumna Dr.



Laura Irimieş, from Babeş-Bolyai University of Cluj-Napoca, shared her experience concerning the application process, as well as tips on preparing the project statement and the other application components. Dr. Irimieş also gave us an overview of the time spent in the U.S. as a Fulbright Visiting Scholar at Arizona State University, Phoenix.

ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

1. Outreach

In the context of the covid-19 pandemic, our outreach efforts were conducted exclusively via online means, which enabled us to continue to promote our programs to students across the country. Despite the problematic situation, we managed to acquaint an average 600 prospective applicants with the opportunities afforded by the U.S. higher education system and the advising services and generous resources awaiting them at FEAC-EducationUSA.

a) Virtual Fairs

We reached an average 100 prospective undergraduate and graduate students through our participation in the Spring 2021 editions of the Romanian International University Fair/RIUF (virtual edition) and Access Masters Online Event. We received significant positive feedback and several of the participants voiced an interest in availing themselves of our services and taking part in our future events.

b) Webinars and Virtual Workshops

We conducted monthly webinars and virtual workshops on topics ranging from "The Liberal Arts Model" to "Writing a Strong Application Essay". We also conducted a series of joint webinars with the American Spaces network. Guest speakers included EducationUSA REAC Katherine Scodova and our first cohort of virtual interns joining us via the VSFS program. An average 500 students from high schools in Bucharest, Bacău, Cluj-Napoca, Craiova, Constanța, Călărași, Medgidia, Pitești, Sibiu, and Târqu Mures joined us online for these events.





2. Opportunity Funds Program

FEAC-EducationUSA kicked off the first **Opportunity Funds** program in Romania in the spring of 2016. In March 2021 we started working with our sixth cohort, made up of four highly promising high school students from Bucharest, Cluj-Napoca, Piatra-Neamţ, and Timişoara. They are currently receiving funding from EducationUSA to cover their application-related fees and personalized quidance every step of the way to boost their chances of admission, with a full scholarship, at a U.S. university. Our cohort advising activities were also

activities were also conducted exclusively online. The EducationUSA

Opportunity Funds program assists highly qualified students who are likely to be awarded full financial aid from U.S. colleges and universities but lack the financial resources to cover the up-front costs of obtaining admission, such as testing or application fees.

Pioneering Handbook for Journalism and Communication Science Education

On March 5, 2021, scholars from Romania and the United States joined forces for their own Fulbright75 event.

Celebrating the launch of the Romanian version of The Changing Education for Journalism and the Communication Occupations: The Impact of Labor Markets (Dinamica educației pentru profesiile din jurnalism și comunicare: Impactul pieței forței de muncă) by Professors Lee Becker and Tudor Vlad from the University of Georgia, the event brought together Romanian and American Fulbright Alumni. The book represents an in-depth analysis of the dynamics of journalism education and occupations in the United States throughout the last thirty years and looks at characteristics and evolutions among students, graduates, and teaching staff.

The book was translated into Romanian by Fulbright Alumna Andreea Voina from Babeș-Bolyai University of Cluj-Napoca and is a pioneering handbook for



journalism and communication science education.

The event goes beyond a mere book launch, it recognizes the contribution of the two authors to the development of the journalism education and profession in Romania throughout the last decades.

Keith Hitchins: The Historian's Honesty

Professor Vasile Puscas, former Minister of European Affairs of Romania, Chief Negotiator with the European Union, and Fulbright alumnus, published a new book devoted to the personality and work of historian and scholar Keith Hitchins, professor at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and the first American grantee to study in Romania under the auspices of the U.S.-Romania Cultural Exchange program back in 1960.

The book, titled *Keith Hitchins: The Historian's Honesty,* traces the career of Prof. Hitchins as one of the leading foreign specialists in Romanian studies, highlighting the vast body of work he produced, the particular relevance and actuality of his approaches, and the assistance he provided to several generations of Romanian historians.

Romanian Cinema Inside Out

Fulbright alumna Dr. Irina Trocan coordinated and edited a critical anthology titled Romanian Cinema Inside Out: Insights on film culture, industry and politics 1912-2019.

The national book launch of the volume took place in July 2021, at Grădina cu filme – Cinema & More in Bucharest. About the book, in Irina's words: "Starting from the first Romanian film to count as cinematic art and getting to the present (and speculative future) of the national industry, Romanian Cinema Inside Out aims to spark conversation on new or rarely discussed topics concerning Romanian films of the past century. Patriotism and intellectual dissatisfaction, national identity and the representation of minorities, a proposed underrated canon of



female filmmakers and educated guesses on what made Romanians under socialism laugh are all approached in this attempt to write Romanian film history/ies." Irina was a 2017-2018 Fulbright Student Researcher in the field of essay cinema at the University of Pennsylvania.



The Development and Role of Infectious Disease Policy in the European Union

On April 2, 2021, Ștefania Kerekeș, 2020-2021 Fulbright Student Researcher at University of Michigan, School of Public Health, held a virtual lecture on "The Development and Role of Infectious Disease Policy in the European Union." The virtual event guided the participants through some of the health policy strategies applicable in case of pandemic outbreak and described how the European Union deals with the actual pandemic.

"Being a Fulbright Visiting Student Researcher at the University of Michigan, School of Public Health," Ștefania wrote, "it is an honor and also an opportunity to connect with a global community where we can share ideas and work together towards a common goal. Conducting research in infectious disease prevention policies is a great challenge in today's world. Collaboration, cooperation and exchange of scientific information are key steps in elaborating strategies that could eliminate the current pandemic or could prevent future pandemics."

U.S. Fulbright Alumna Elizabeth Wiita Wins Prestigious Gates Cambridge Scholarship

In February 2021, U.S. Fulbright alumna Elizabeth Wiita was awarded a Gates Cambridge Scholarship to pursue a Ph.D. in Chemistry at the University of Cambridge. After graduating from Barnard College, Elli was a 2019-2020 Fulbright Student Researcher at Petroleum-Gas University of Ploiesti, and continued her studies at Columbia University's Fu Foundation School of Engineering and Applied Science, as a National Science Foundation (NSF) Fellow.

"The opportunity to pursue research in Romania, in particular with Professor Dragoș Ciuparu, was instrumental to my development as a scientist and to being awarded this scholarship. I am incredibly grateful for your generosity and to the Petrol-Gaze University for their support." During her PhD in Chemistry, Elli will focus on the cellular processes that are fundamental for creating targeted health treatments, such as therapeutics, genome editing, and vaccines. "With this research," Elli wrote, "I seek to address not only crucial scientific questions, but also gaps in international medical care, where stable and easily transportable therapeutics are crucial in ameliorating health disparities."
